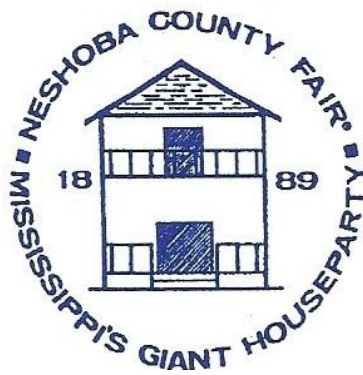

Furthermore, each camper and all occupants thereof agree to abide by the rules and regulations set forth in the Camper Handbook. Failure to comply with the Camper Handbook may result in removal from the Grounds of the NCFA.

The Neshoba County Fair Association (NCFA) Camper Regulations

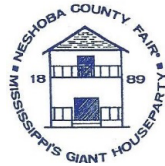
Every effort has been made to provide each camper with the necessary things to make your stay at the NCF enjoyable and relaxing. Please read the following regulations carefully to understand what is expected and required of you while camping at the NCF.

1. All camper fees must be paid in person or mailed to The Neshoba County Fair Association, 16800 Highway 21 South, Philadelphia, MS 39350. Our office is upstairs in the NCFA building on the southwest corner of Founder's Square.
2. Payment (\$300 for 30 amp; \$350 for 50 amp) for the next NCF is due by April 1 each year. After April 1, a late fee of \$50.00 will be charged; if payment, with a late fee, is not made by May 1, the space will be automatically given up and assigned to another party by the NCF Camper Committee. **Notice or reminders of Camper Payment will not be sent. It is the camper's responsibility to see that payment arrives on time.**
3. Permanent Camper Lessee must notify the NCF office two weeks before the first day of the NCF if you wish to sublease your camper site.
4. The NCF Camper Committee will handle subleasing by selecting from our temporary camper list—definition of subleasing: any use or occupant of a camper site other than the assigned person. Failure to comply with this rule will result in forfeiting your site.
5. Your camper site number should be on the camper, visible in an emergency.
6. The original lessee cannot transfer their assigned camping space to any other party. All transfers will be handled by the NCF Camper Committee. The original lessee may request immediate family (definition of immediate family; parents, spouse, children, or grandchildren only) over the age of 21 be added to their camper site.
7. Depending on location, camper spaces are approximately 16 feet wide by 40 feet long. This width should provide enough room for a sitting area by the door of each camper. Many camper sites were developed long before slide-outs were available to campers. If you are assigned and agree to one of the smaller sites and have a slide, you may not be able to extend your awning fully. **Be a good neighbor by not crowding someone's space.**
8. Water and electrical hookups are provided for each camper space.
9. Only the NCF electrician is authorized to do any electrical work in the RV campground. The campers are responsible for keeping these connections tight and secure to prevent electrical shock and water leaks.
10. Each camper must maintain a minimum two feet clearance from the electrical panel to allow access by the NCF electrician in an emergency.
11. Sewage hookups are provided for each camper space.
12. The campers are responsible for keeping these connections tight and secure to prevent contamination from sewage-holding tanks, lines, and the ground from flooding due to leaking water. **Campers must use a sewer line 'doughnut' or sewer connector elbow when attaching the camper sewer system.**
13. If space is available, each camper is allotted two car permits for parking in the camper area. Car permits must be firmly attached to the lower front windshield on the driver's side of the automobile. Permits found taped to the windshield or otherwise improperly mounted will be confiscated. **There are no reserved vehicle parking spaces.** Parking permits will not be mailed but must be picked up at the camper permit office behind the caretaker's home two weekends before the NCF and on Wednesday and Thursday, the week the NCF begins. Permits not picked up by Friday the Fair starts must be picked up at the NCF office on the Southwest corner of Founder's Square. **The person whose name is listed on the site must pick up permits.**
14. No horse trailers allowed.
15. No reserved seating at the grandstand.
16. All pets must be on a leash, with the pet handler properly disposing of the animal's waste.
17. Campers may pull on site beginning May 21, 2027.
18. Electricity and water will be connected May 26, 2027, and will be disconnected July 7, 2027.
19. Campers must understand that security will not be on duty except on weekends and one week before the NCF. The NCFA cannot be held responsible for the well-being of your camper.
20. Campers, wooden pallets, plyboards, carpets, or other manufactured materials must be removed by the second Monday after the NCF ends each year. **If not, the camper owner will be billed a clean-up fee of \$100.**
21. Primitive camping and sleeping tents outside the camper are **prohibited** on the Fairgrounds.
22. Go-carts, Mini-Bikes, Golf Carts, Bicycles, ATVs, and any other personal conveyance (except handicapped mobility equipment) are not allowed on the grounds unless used officially. Car permits are not to be used for these vehicles.
23. A responsible adult (a person over 21) will oversee each camper before and during the NCF. That person must be physically present at the fairgrounds. **The camper lessee will be responsible for any damage or disturbances that may occur at the camper site.**

24. All house and ground rules established by the NCFA for cabin owners also apply to camper owners.
25. Campers who willfully disregard the Rules and Regulations of the NCFA will be removed from the fairgrounds, and the camping space will automatically be given up.
26. **In any area designated No Parking by the NCFA, all expenses incurred with towing, recovery, and any other expense will be the sole responsibility of the vehicle owner.**
27. Only soft coolers are allowed in public areas of the fairgrounds. Public areas shall be defined as any location within the grounds of the NCFA, except for those areas that are a part of cabins and campers.
28. Shuttle service for the physically challenged will be provided daily from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. with stops at the Gate 2 accessible parking area, Founders Square, the Grandstand, and Gate 1 Ticket Office. This service is free to our physically challenged patrons, although an NCF ticket purchase will still be required for admission to the fairgrounds.
29. The NCFA forbids anyone from flying a drone or any remote-controlled aircraft in the skies over any properties of the NCFA.
30. Payment of Cabin and Camper fees signifies that you agree to hold the Neshoba County Fair Association, Inc. harmless for any liability inside your cabin or camper premises.
31. No tent spikes, metal pins or screw anchors maybe used due to underground utilities.
32. No camper owner shall remove any fence or post to pull campers through, due to the risk of damage to sewer and water lines. Any damage resulting from failure to follow this rule will be the responsibility of the camper owner, and may result in repair costs, and/or a fine.
